## LOOKING AT CMOS CITATIONS

Which citation style should I use?

There are 3 citation styles that are most commonly used in academic writing:

1. *APA (American Psychological Association)*
2. *MLA (Modern Language Association)*
3. *Chicago Manual of Style / Turabian (CMOS) which supports two systems:  
(1) Notes and Bibliography (NB) and  
(2) Author-Date (AD).*

**“Chicago NB” stands for Notes and Bibliography, where footnotes or endnotes (N) are used for in-text citations and the whole paper has a bibliography (B) at the end.**

## One Hundred Years of Marquez

An article about Gabriel Garcia Marquez, the renowned author

Gabriel Garcia Marquez was born in Columbia in 1927. He is one of the most celebrated Spanish writers of the twentieth century. Marquez started his career as a journalist but soon began to publish short stories and books.<sup>1</sup> Some of his most famous novels are *One Hundred Years of Solitude* and *Love in the Time of Cholera*. Marquez used elements of fantasy to highlight the theme of solitude in his novels.<sup>2</sup> His distinct style of writing made him very popular. In 1982, he was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature.<sup>3</sup> Today, his works are taught in universities around the world.
